What is AICE?

Ocoee HS is one of seven high schools in OCPS who offer the Cambridge Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) Diploma Program. The AICE program allows our students to achieve the prestigious AICE Diploma, recognized by well-known universities in the United States as well as internationally. This rigorous academic program emphasizes the importance of critical thinking skills and communication in today's global world.

Knights have the opportunity to take individual classes from the AICE program to challenge themselves academically or put themselves on track to go through the full course progression meeting certain qualifications to qualify for the AICE Diploma.

AICE Curriculum Categories

Students must complete at least one AS level course from each category below plus three additional of their choosing and complete the required Global Perspectives course (total of 7).

Students must complete a minimum of 14 AICE credits* identified by the Cambridge Assessment International Education (Cambridge International) in the Diploma Core and three academic areas as follows:

- . Group 1- Mathematics and Sciences (Two Credits required)
- Group 2-Languages 9 (Two Credits required)
- . Group 3- Arts and Humanities (Two Credits required)
- . Group 4- Interdisciplinary Skills (Optional Four Credits)
- · Six additional credits required in any combination from the above four groups.
- *Students earn one credit by completing and passing one AICE full credit course and another credit for taking the corresponding AICE Examination



AICE = High Rigor



AICE (and AP) are the most rigorous options available to Ocoee students.

Admissions officers often express that they'd like to see students exhaust all high rigor courses available on campus before turning to Dual Enrollment.

Colleges value rigor of curriculum when it comes to application evaluation.

AICE courses prepare students for college level courses. Studies by the University of Florida and University of Virginia show the AICE Diploma students earn higher grade point averages in college than AP or IB students.

Benefits of AICE

AICE not only prepares students to get into a university with up to 45 hours of college credit, but it also provides them the skills required to be successful once there.

AICE students who earn the AICE Diploma and complete 100 hours of community service earn the maximum Florida Bright Futures Scholarship.

The AICE Diploma is internationally used and recognized. The program is offered solely through a division of the University of Cambridge which is consistently ranked as one the top five academic institutions in the world.





AICE & Bright Futures Scholarship

AICE Students are eligible for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship.

Students who:

1. Earn an AICE Diploma based on AICE exams taken prior to and during the high school graduation exam administration series ending mid-June

 Complete 100 hours of community service
 Submit their Florida Financial Aid Application by their high school graduation date will earn the Florida Academic Scholars award



*It is important to remember that while AICE Diploma holders will receive the Florida Academic Scholars award, students will still need to put in the time and effort required to gain admission to the college(s) of their choice.

AICE Testing

- Exam dates and times released in October, students and teachers are informed by Mr.
 O'Brien
- AICE exams are prioritized because there are no make up dates
- Some AICE exams occur after school ends
- Plan to arrive at least 15 minutes before your scheduled test time
- You must bring the equipment you need to the exam (pens, pencils, rulers etc)
- We will <u>not</u> provide calculators
- Make sure you turn off all electronics and store them in a bag before entering the testing location
- No bags are allowed in the testing room
- All student belongings will be put in a room beside your testing location
- All exams are paper/pencil and in person

Frequently Asked Questions

- Is AICE accepted where I want to attend college?
 - As with all programs, be sure to check with the school admissions office to verify what
 is accepted
 - A quick, easy way to search → run a google search and type in (Name of the School)
 AICE Exam Credit and it should help you pull equivalencies for that school
- Do students have to earn the full AICE Diploma in order to earn college credits?
 - No- Colleges award credit on a subject-by-subject basis according to grades earned on individual exams passed
- Are AICE students able to take other accelerated courses outside of AICE classes?
 - Yes- AICE students are encouraged to take AP courses available such as AP Calc, AP Government, etc.

Frequently Asked Questions

- What are passing scores of an AICE exam?
 - Passing scores for an AICE exam are A through E with the failing score of U. Compared to AP, an E is a 3 while a U is a 1 or 2
- What are the different types of AICE Diplomas you can earn?
 - There are three types of AICE Diplomas and which you earn is based on the exam scores
 you receive for your seven AICE courses. From easiest to less easiest → Diploma at Pass
 level, Diploma with Merit, and Diploma with Distinction
- As a senior, how can I ensure colleges get my AICE scores?
 - Seniors will use the <u>Grade Transcript Service</u> to send scores to colleges & universities
